



Drug and Alcohol Policy

Drug Use/Possession Policy:

First Offense of possession or use of illegal drugs by an AHS Boys Lacrosse player will result in immediate suspension of the player from the Allen High School Boys Lacrosse Club for the remainder of the school year. This suspension will occur whether the occurrence happens on or off school property, or at an AHS Boys Lacrosse event. There are no exceptions.

If suspended, and the player is interested in rejoining AHS Boys Lacrosse Club for the following school year, the player and parent(s) must petition, prior to the following school year, the Allen H.S. Boys Lacrosse Board for reinstatement for the following school year.

Alcohol Use/Possession Policy:

First offense of possession or use of alcohol by an AHS Boys Lacrosse player at an AHS Boys Lacrosse event will result in immediate suspension of the player for the rest of the school year.

If the offense occurs on AISD property (not at an AHS Boys Lacrosse event), the board will decide upon the player consequence, with a minimum of game and practice suspension(s) for the duration of the player's attendance at the Dillard Center.

For an offense not on school property (not at an AHS Boys Lacrosse event), the player will be assessed with game and practice suspension(s) as deemed appropriate by the AHS Boys Lacrosse Board.

If a player is suspended for the rest of the current school year and is interested in rejoining AHS Boys Lacrosse Club for the following school year, the player and parent(s) must petition, prior to the following school year, the Allen H.S. Boys Lacrosse Board for reinstatement for the following school year.

Permanent Expulsion: If a player is suspended for the remainder of the school year for a Drug or Alcohol offense, and is allowed to re-join the AHS Boys Lacrosse Club upon receiving board approval, then the next offense relating to either Drugs or Alcohol, will result in permanent, immediate expulsion of the player from the Allen H.S. Boys Lacrosse Club for the rest of his AHS career.

Appeals: A player / parent may appeal the initial suspension to the board. A permanent expulsion may not be appealed. The appeal must be in writing and addressed to the Entire Board and mailed or delivered to the President. Appeals will be addressed at the next regularly scheduled Executive Board Meeting, unless at the option of the President, the next meeting is too far off, she/he may call a special meeting giving the other Executive Board Members at least 3 days notice. Final resolution shall be the decision of the majority vote of the Executive Board. If a member of the Executive Board is the party appealing the Executive Board decision, that member shall not attend the portion of the meeting to discuss the appeal nor shall that member have a vote.
